Proud veteran of Israel's historic six-day war.

Choice of the NATO alliance. Selected by major western and third-world countries for their armies.

Uzi. In the hands of the U.S. Secret Service it protects the President of the United States.

Designed by an officer of the Israeli Army and introduced to the world in 1954, the Uzi 9mm submachine gun has been lavishly praised in the pages of Small Arms of the World, Jane's Small Arms, The World's Submachine Guns, and many other authoritative publications.

Everywhere the judgement is the same: the Uzi is the finest sub-machine gun ever designed. Now, as a semi-automatic carbine, the Uzi is available – for the first time in history – to collectors in the United States.

Adapted by its designer, Col. Uzı Gal (Ret.), to meet the requirements

of Federal regulations in the United States, the Uzi is manufactured for the U.S. market by Israel Military Industries, producers of the original model and exclusive supplier of the Uzi to the Israel army.

In appearance the Uzi submachine gun and the semi-automatic are identical, except for the longer barrel length of the new model. The principal difference between the two is that the semi-automatic works from a closed breech with a floating firing pin, while the standard submachine gun operates from an open breech with a fixed firing pin. Both are blowback operated.

Like the standard submachine gun, the semi-automatic has a very low recoil and can be fired comfortably and accurately while held in only one hand.

The caliber of the semi-automatic, 9mm Parabellum, is the same as the submachine gun. With its 16.1" barrel length, the carbine delivers a muzzle velocity of 1250 to 1500 feet per second, depending

on type of ammunition used. The long barrel, coupled with the closed breech, provides accuracy of fire and stability of operation in every conceivable circumstance.

Collectors will be glad to know that the qualities that distinguished the Uzi submachine gun, both in terms of efficiency of operation and human engineering, are prominent features of the semi-automatic: stability, compactness, reliability, a center of gravity that provides excellent balance and comfortable handling, ease of cleaning and maintenance, and accurate firepower. These qualities make the Uzi a pleasure to own and use.

Those fortunate enough to obtain an Uzi will receive a certificate signed by Col. Uzi Gal certifying that the gun was designed by him, and that it was made by the same manufacturers' as his original submachine





Each Uzi semi-automatic is delivered to its owner in a molded Styrofoam case, complete with carrying sling, a 25-round maga-Two barrels are supplied with each Uzi: a 16.1" barrel that
